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# Préface

Le but premier de cette publication demeure la distribution des catalogues canadiens d'art contemporain. Les changements de format et de structure nous permettront de publier plus fréquemment ce répertoire. Cette réorientation facilitera la diffusion et actualisera l'information sur les catalogues canadiens. En fin de compte, ceci devrait augmenter le nombre de catalogues distribués, particulièrement dans les librairies, au Canada comme à l'étranger.

Puisque nous avons l'intention de publier ce "bulletin" deux fois par année, nous n'avons pas établi une liste tout à fait exhaustive des catalogues publiés depuis notre dernière édition d'août 1983. Certains catalogues qui pourraient ne pas apparaître ici se retrouveront assurément dans un prochain numéro. Malheureusement, nous avons dû exclure certains catalogues moins substantiels qui, jusqu'à date, étaient répertoriés dans l'index des galeries. Toutefois, dans un prochain numéro nous projetons de donner la liste complète des publications de chaque galerie.

Pour la première fois, nous ajoutons un certain nombre de livres et de catalogues américains et européens que nous distribuons ainsi qu'une sélection de livres et de catalogues disponibles à notre librairie. En plus, vous trouverez une liste des revues canadiennes d'art et de culture que nous déposons dans notre Centre de Documentation. Dans nos numéros à venir, nous développerons cette approche afin de couvrir encore mieux toute source d'information sur l'art au Canada.

The primary purpose of this publication continues to be the distribution of Canadian catalogues on contemporary art. The changes in format and structure will allow for a more frequent publication of this repertoire and thus facilitate the dissemination of more up-to-date information about Canadian catalogues. Ultimately, this should increase the number of catalogues distributed, particularly to bookstores in Canada and abroad.

As we now intend to publish this "bulletin" twice yearly, we have not been quite as exhaustive in collecting every catalogue published since our last edition of August, 1983. Those catalogues not included herein will undoubtedly appear in future bulletins. Unfortunately, we have had to exclude less substantial catalogues which in the past were listed in the gallery index. However, we intend in a future issue to print a complete listing of publications from each gallery.

As a new feature we are introducing a number of European and American catalogues and books we now distribute, and a selection of books and catalogues available from Artexte's bookstore. In addition, we have included a list of Canadian art and culture magazines that we collect in our Documentation Centre. We hope to expand on this idea in upcoming issue so as to provide more coverage on primary sources of information on Canadian art.

## Reader's Guide

Reviewed catalogues are listed alphabetically by artist in the case of a solo exhibition, or in the case of a group show, by catalogue title.

Each review includes biographical data on the catalogue and a brief resume of the content.

Bibliographical data is ordered as follows: 1. artist's name or title of catalogue 2. author(s) 3. gallery and place of publication 4. year 5. number of pages 6. number of illustrations 7. dimensions (width precedes height).

Reviews appear in the language in which the catalogue was published (either French or English); bilingual catalogues are reviewed in both languages.

Unless otherwise indicated, all catalogues are softcover.
